Regularly talk to my parents and my teachers about my progress in school using the Schoology platform.	
Attend after school tutoring if I have difficulty with assignments.	
Demonstrate respect for my principal, teachers, school staff members, and other students.

Create a learning environment where students feel safe, respected, and nurtured.	
Provide high quality curriculum and instruction & challenge all students to learn at rigorous level of thinking.	
Enforce rules equitably and involve students in creating a warm and caring learning environment in class.	
Communicate regularly with families about their child's progress in school.	
Provide assistance to families on what they can do to support their child's learning.	
Participate in shared decision making with other school staff and families for the benefit of students.	
Participate in professional development opportunities that improve teaching and learning and support the	
formation of partnerships with families and the community.	
Participate in the Home Visit program
