

# Bear Valley Dress Code

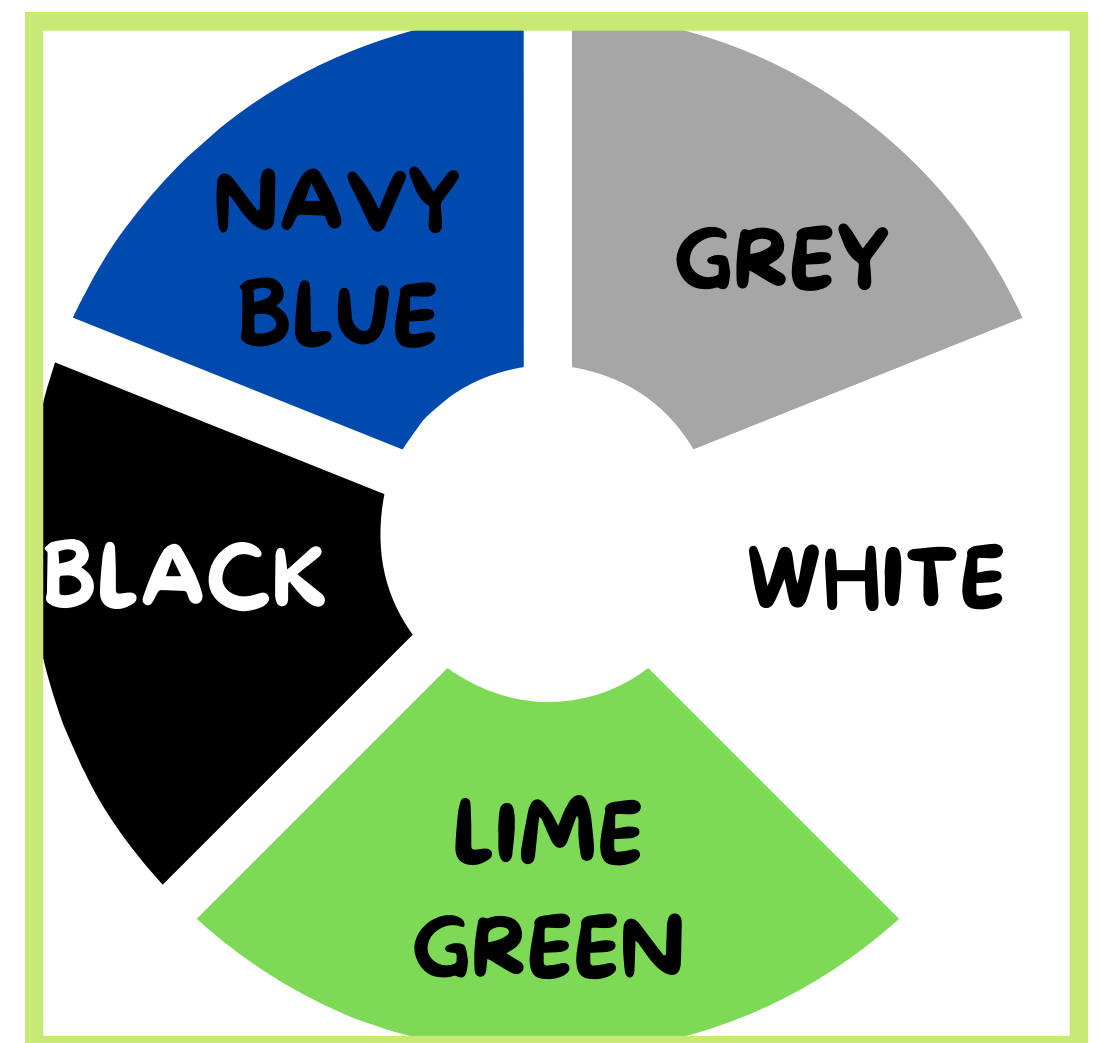

## Shirts & Outerwear

Shirts & outerwear must be within the 5 approved color wheel of **black, navy blue, grey, white or lime green.**

Tops must be **plain and free of logos** unless the logo can be covered by 3 stacked fingers

*Students can still wear BVIS logo'd t-shirts and hoodies if they have from previous years!*

## Acceptable Dress

- Tops and outerwear (hoodies or sweaters) must be in the 5 approved colors (black, navy blue, grey, white or lime green) and be plain with no logos that can't be covered up with 3 stacked fingers.
- Tank tops must have straps that are 3 fingers wide
- Hats or beanies
- Shorts and skirts must be at or below fingertips with arms at sides
- Pants, shorts, & skirts can be worn in any color/style but must adequately cover legs.

## Unacceptable Dress

- Sweatshirt hoods on head while inside the school building
- Sunglasses inside school building
- Any article of clothing promoting drugs, alcohol, violence, discrimination, sexual innuendo, derogatory language, gangs, or any illegal activity
- Tops can't be cut, tied or rolled up and no portion of belly can be exposed.
- Tube tops
