Additional Descriptions of Year 1 Pathway Courses

	Visual Art Pathway: If you're interested in becoming an artist or designer, this may be the pathway for you!
Course Name	<u>Course Description</u>
Foundations of Art	Based on art principles and introduces additional art elements and materials to be mastered at a higher skill level. Students will experiment with a wide variety of media and concepts.

Instrumenta	al Music Pathway: If you're interested in becoming a musician, producer, or conductor, this may be the pathway for you!
Course Name	<u>Course Description</u>
Band/Concert	Encourages qualified students to rehearse and to play a variety of musical literature both individually and collectively. The course emphasizes preparation for public performances.
Orchestra / String Honors	Minimum of one year experience needed at the middle school level with standard string orchestra instruments (violin, viola, cello, string & electric bass). Students explore music from the baroque through the contemporary era.
Drumline Beginning	- Students will learn to read music, use proper drumming technique, and march on the field. You will be expected to demonstrate competency on snare drum, bass drum, cymbals, and smaller instruments of the battery.
Piano Beginning	No prior music experience necessary. Students will learn basic piano performance skills, note reading, music theory, as well as create and respond to a variety of musical genres, styles, historical periods, and cultures.

Choir Pathway: If you're interested in becoming a performer or just enjoy singing, this may be the pathway for you!	
Course Name	<u>Course Description</u>
Novice Choir	Introduces the basic choral skills of part-singing, music reading, music theory, and symbols.
Choir Honors	For students who successfully audition and meet the requirements of this performing group, the course offers those selected students a chance to sing a wide variety of the world's best choral music; instruction is given in advanced vocal techniques and interpretations.

CTE Foundations of Design	This class introduces students to a variety of programs and occupations in the arts, audio/video technology, and communication systems, providing foundational skills in multimedia and digital platforms. Because Graphic Design and Audio / Video Production are both part of the CTE CreativeConnect program, this year 1 course is mirrored in both pathway options.
