School Uniforms

As we implement this new policy we are conscious of the impact on families. We are offering affordable options - \$10/shirt with bulk purchase discounts - as well as more customizable options found through our SpiritWear Store online. For families experiencing financial hardship, please work with our Family Liaison to discuss options.



Uniform Highlights:

• Shirts & Tops: Must have BVIS logo

Pants: Must be worn to maintain personal privacy - no underwear exposed
 Headwear: No hats, hoodies with hood up or sunglasses can be worn indoors

Free Dress & Spirit Days:

BVIS will have scheduled free dress and spirit days throughout the year.

Continuity of Care

We have recognized that throughout this past school year some families experienced challenges in knowing how to effectively communicate with school staff and students' teachers. In the coming school year we will be implementing some structures to ensure a strong continuity of care for our students and develop more fluid means of communication between the school and the home.

- Family Liaison BVIS has hired a Liaison to work directly with families to bridge the school-home divide and improve communication throughout the school.
- Social Emotional Learning Every student will begin the day with an SEL homeroom class
 where they will work on developing strong relationships with their homeroom teacher and
 their peers. This teacher will be our families' primary teacher contact.
- Grade Level Assigned Student Support There will be one Student Support person assigned
 to each grade level. If your child is experiencing difficulty with student-to-student
 relationships you will have one consistent person to connect to.
- Grade Level Assigned School Leader There will be one Assistant Principal assigned to each
 grade level. If you have any concerns whatsoever you will know exactly who to reach out
 to for support.

All of the changes listed above are just a simple snapshot of the great things we have to look forward to next year that will help BVIS be the strongest school community for your children. If you have any questions or concerns, in August we will have Back to School meetings to answer questions and get feedback from our families. We look forward to seeing you there and partnering together in service of your students. Until then, we wish you a wonderful summer as we plan for an amazing school year in 2022-2023!
